

Statement on Human Trafficking and Slavery

As a responsible corporate citizen, Sprint shares the global concerns related to human trafficking and slavery. In general, these practices can involve one person or a group of people holding another person or group of people and forcing them into servitude. Such crimes are reported to impact millions upon millions of victims per year (www.state.gov/g/tip/rls/tiprpt/2011/).

Sprint is firmly opposed to human trafficking and slavery and will not knowingly tolerate either practice.

Sprint includes in its agreements with its Suppliers a requirement that the Suppliers agree to conduct business in an ethical manner that is consistent with the [Sprint Code of Supplier Conduct](#). Furthermore, Suppliers are required to comply with all relevant federal, state and local laws, including those related to human trafficking and slavery. Sprint employees can use the company's confidential [Ethics Helpline](#) and Employee Helpline to report actions which may violate company policies and /or laws or regulations, including any account of human trafficking or slavery.
